Pastor's Page - Dec./Jan. 2019-20

"Frustration is better than laughter, because a sad face is good for the heart. The heart of the wise is in the house of mourning, but the heart of fools is in the house of pleasure." (Ecclesiastes 7:3-4)

A note from the pastor

"Enthusiastically frustrated" – this is how my mentor described my ministry at the end of 2019. Around the 5th year of a pastoral appointment, if you feel that you are not there where you hoped to be, then you feel "enthusiastically frustrated." As I look at worship attendance, giving reports, Sunday School adjustments, youth group attendance, and volunteer numbers, I am disappointed with where we are. When I started my ministry with MUMC in May 2015, I hoped to fill every pew with young families. I hoped Sunday School classes would be overflowing with children. While we have not reached my ministry goals, there have been other celebrations. While I question what I've not done right or could have done differently over the years, I know that I am right where God has called me to be. I also know that in this increasingly secularized society, clergy and churches (in all denominations) are feeling the same feelings of frustration.

I hope all of you had a Happy Thanksgiving. It's hard to believe that Christmas is only a few weeks away. As we wrap up 2019, I invite us to refocus on the life-giving gospel of Jesus Christ. Let's hear again the good news that God sent His only son for me, for our congregation, for the world. In the midst of our division and questions over the future of our denomination, let's remember the hearts of Methodist circuit riders, who rode from town to town with nothing but a passionate desire to share the gospel of Jesus Christ. They led vibrant revival meetings. They led people to healing, recovery, reconciliation, and conversion. They inspired social justice movements for civil rights, women's rights, children's rights, and workers' rights. They opened churches, schools, universities, hospitals, and orphanages. When we remember our roots of faith, we celebrate a rich and proud legacy that's endured both good times and bad. We have a legacy that inspires us onward and upwards – pressing on toward the goal for which Christ Jesus has taken hold of us.

In his letter to the Ephesians, Paul prays that the eyes of our heart may be opened so that we may know the hope to which God has called us. With eyes of faith, may we remember the movement of the Holy Spirit in the past. May we hear the whispers of the Holy Spirit in the present. May we follow the leadings of the Holy Spirit into the future – not with fear but faith – not with frustration but hope.

There is so much that God is doing in MUMC. In the past year alone, there have been so many answered prayers. There are so many blessings in our midst. Therefore, I am grateful for my 'enthusiastic frustration.' I am grateful for the reminder that I/we are not the owners of MUMC ministry. Christ is the head of the Church. We are not called to be successful (by the world's standards.) We are called to be faithful in any/every circumstance. We are called to bear witness to the greatest news in the world – that God loves us, God is with us, and Salvation was born among us in Bethlehem two thousand years ago.

I hope that you will join us for Christmas Eve services at 4 pm, 7 pm and 10 pm. We will serve holy communion in each service. We will sing carols and light candles. Let's gather for worship and give thanks to our good and gracious God!



Nov. 16th NICUMC Special Session Summary Report

Pastor Sarah & Shari Millard attended Special Session on Nov. 16th at Kishwaukee College. Clergy and Lay members of the annual conference gathered to hear the latest financial report and to approve the 2020 budget for the Northern Illinois Conference. 2019 was a very hard financial year for our Conference.

The Northern Illinois Conference used to operate at a 7.5 to 8-million-dollar level for it's annual budget. It has decreased gradually and 2019 was the worst apportionment paid year in the last 20 years. We now have a budget for 2019 and 2020 under 5 million dollars. In order to reduce expenses, the Cabinet will eliminate one District Administrative Assistant position. This means we will have two district offices shared by all 6 Districts. District Superintendents will rely more on their personal devices to communicate and connect with local churches. In 2021, our Conference will decrease from 6 Districts to 5 Districts.

The Conference Finance Committee apologized for two things. First, last year, they recommended that the Northern Illinois Conference not pay the General Church Administrative portion of the apportionments following the results of the Special Session of General Conference. This change caused confusion among local churches. As a result, the Northern Illinois Conference paid only 8% of their General Church apportionment. Starting in January 2020, the General Church Apportionment portion will be added back to the apportionment statement. The second apology was for changing the method of billing. In 2019, they only emailed statements and some churches with old or bad email addresses never received their statements. Starting Jan. of 2020, apportionment statements will once again be mailed.

We also heard a report from the Conference Exploration Team. This team was formed in 2019 to consider the future of our Annual Conference in relation to the larger denomination. They reported that they will prepare multiple strategies to respond to the decisions made at the 2020 General Conference.

During the Opening Worship, Bishop Sally Dyck asked all of us to not press charges against one another. While we will have the ability to press charges against anyone in our Annual Conference around issues of human sexuality, she reminded us that each trial costs between \$50,000 to \$100,000. This is money we do not have. She highlighted that we should keep in mind the 3 Simple Rules of Methodists: Do No Harm, Do Good, and Stay in love with God. While we are anxious and can only guess what might happen at the 2020 General Conference, let's be in prayer. Let's pray for the unity of Christ's love in the Church. Let's continue to serve. Let's continue to love and listen to one another. Finally, let's continue to carry out the mission of Jesus Christ to which we are ALL called.


