WHAT IF YOU WERE FRIENDS WITH MISTER ROGERS? Tom Hanks portrays Mister Rogers in A BEAUTIFUL DAY IN THE NEIGHBORHOOD, a timely story of kindness triumphing over cynicism, based on the true story of a real-life friendship between Fred Rogers and journalist Tom Junod. After a jaded magazine writer (Emmy winner Matthew Rhys) is assigned a profile of Fred Rogers, he overcomes his skepticism, learning about kindness, love and forgiveness from America’s most beloved neighbor. Have you ever had a friend who changed your life? In A BEAUTIFUL DAY IN THE NEIGHBORHOOD, Mister Rogers loves his friend Lloyd by listening to his story, hearing his hurt, and encouraging him to forgive. He sees and accepts his friend as a child of God, illustrating how one person can inspire a world of kindness. As an ordained minister, Mister Rogers famously considered his work in television to be a ministry. He called the space between the TV set and the viewer “holy ground.” Perhaps you grew up watching Mister Rogers’ Neighborhood. The red sweater, Daniel Tiger, and the Neighborhood of Make-Believe remind you of childhood. Perhaps his episodes were the only times you ever heard someone say, “There’s no person in the whole world like you. I like you just the way you are.” Mister Rogers lived out an embodied Gospel, showing friendship and love to anyone he met. Every day, you have the opportunity to love your neighbor and live out Fred’s legacy of faith and friendship.
