Blessings on your Lenten Journey! As we celebrated the gift of love on Valentine's Day, we were challenged to discover the source of love. I remind us that Lent is not only a period of sorrow and sacrifice. It's also a season when we renew our love and devotion to Jesus Christ. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday (March 2) and continues until the day before Easter (April 16). I pray that our Minooka UMC family and friends will experience the love of Christ this season.

Let me share several ways you can enrich your Lent journey. First, join an All Church Lenten Small Groups. We will focus on the curriculum, "24 Hours," by Adam Hamilton. This is a six-week study focusing on the final 24 hours of our Lord's life. Second, tune into our mid-week devotion, which is offered every Wednesday @ 10 AM on Facebook live. (The link is emailed every Friday.) This is a 10-minute midweek devotion designed to encourage and deepen your faith. Third, volunteer to help at our annual Fish Fry. You can serve on the Thursday prep team. You can join the Friday cooking or serving crew. You can also help behind the scenes by purchasing the delicious meals every Friday, spreading the word to friends and neighbors, and praying that this meal blesses our neighbors.

Speaking of blessing neighbors, our **February sermon series**, "Greatest Commandments," reminded us to love God with all our heart, mind, soul, and strength, and love our neighbors as ourselves. This series prepared us for the Lenten season. Based on our practice of love – to everyone, every day, may we encounter the Source of love over the next 40 days.

I am proud of our Youth Group, which collected money to buy honey bees for the Heifer International project. I am grateful for our Sunday School students and Youth, who created Valentine's Day cards for seniors in our community seniors, as well as our service men & women. These are clear examples of how we can extend our love tangibly to those around us. **All of us can do something to help our neighbors far and near with Christ's love.**

I want to thank Chris Vause and Capital Campaign Team for their work keeping us informed on what's happening with our building project. As we see the progress on Ridge Road, let's support our team's work so that we can transition smoothly into **Phase II. Your initial gift and pledge are helping us make this vision a reality**. I am excited to grow with MUMC during this exciting season of our history.

On February 6, our MUMC leadership team hosted our **All Church Leadership Retreat**. The Retreat was both in-person and online. Finance Committee Update 2022

The Finance Committee may not be CFOs or CEOs but they made some pretty good financial decisions over the past year. The Finance Committee moved our building funds from the higher-risk investments in the Stock Market, where the funds had been growing for years, to a low-risk fund. The Stock market then begins its decline. Most of the church construction materials were purchased before the lumber price increase and before a majority of recent inflationary costs. The building is being built with our dollars that have not depreciated but have increased over the years. The Stock Market Investments selected over the years and our Building Fund management to start the building of our New Church at present has turned out to be a Financial Blessing. Thank you for all your support.

John Wesley said, "I look on all the world as my parish; thus far I mean, that, in whatever part of it I am, I judge it meet, right, and my bounden duty, to declare unto all that are willing to hear, the glad tidings of salvation."— Journal (11 June 1739)

John Wesley was an ordained theologian but, long story short, no one would give him a church to preach in. As time passed, he recognized that open-air services were successful in reaching men and women who would not enter most churches. From then on he took the opportunities to preach wherever an assembly could be brought together, more than once using his father's tombstone at Epworth as a pulpit. Wesley continued for fifty years — entering churches when he was invited, and taking his stand in the fields, in halls, cottages and chapels, when the churches would not receive him.

John Wesley used unusual methods which became what we now know as the Methodist church. Some 280 years later, here we are still having to devise different methods to reach people with the Gospel.

"We are shoeing the horse as we ride it." The pandemic changed many things about our lives, not the least being how we worship together. Before 2020 we had thought about offering online services but had no idea how to go about it, so the idea fell through the cracks. However, when churches were closed due to the pandemic we became desperate to do something. We quickly figured out how to use Facebook live to reach our congregation and beyond. One good thing is that through livestreaming all churches are now on a level playing field – the large churches no longer have an advantage over the small churches. Think about that. We, WE, Minooka United Methodist Church, can now reach everyone, everywhere in the world with the message of the Gospel just as easily as the biggest megachurches with huge budgets can. When the printing press was invented EVERYONE could have a Bible. Now, through the miracle of technology EVERYONE can hear the Gospel.

There are people who have never walked into our church but consider themselves our church family because they attend online. I personally know one lady who attends online and also requests prayers from our church for her family members. She told me that she never felt comfortable asking for prayers from people at the church she had attended for many years. We are meeting a need.

Some of the reasons given for attending church services online are: craving connection but feeling disconnected at inperson church because people tend to be coupled up and they are a single person (the opposite could also be true), health issues, anxiety, physical challenges, haven't been to church for a long time or maybe not ever. We need to figure out what the need is and how to meet it.

When it comes to evangelism - many of us are shy about inviting others to church. How much easier can it be than to share the link to our church's online worship service?

Pastor Sarah, Katie Wojcieszak and I recently attended an online leadership training session offered by United Methodist Church of Resurrection in Kansas City about engaging our church online. We learned some useful things. We are doing a lot right. We are not alone in the problems we've been experiencing while trying to use technology. And there are things we can improve upon. In the coming weeks we will be considering the things we need to do differently or better. Two things to remember are -1) The church universal has always resisted change but that does not impact the Gospel; and 2) It's not going back to the way it was. We're rebuilding.

Some things we'll be able to change ourselves. There are other things we'll need help with. I hope that we can count on your help and input to improve our online presence.

"Engaging Your Church Online" Leadership Training Recap by Katie Wojcieszak

As Cindy mentioned in her article, during this training it was nice to hear that other churches are having similar struggles with lacking internet and learning online platforms. Some churches that are much bigger than us wrestled with and continue to wrestle with the major changes we have all endured as a result of the pandemic. Some churches have tons of volunteers, lots of money and loads of staff and they still struggled with the transition from doing everything in-person to doing everything online. Along with these struggles comes the realization that church outreach is no longer limited by the front doors due to livestreaming. Cindy hit the nail on the said when she said these gifts have leveled the playing field for every church.

With that being said, this training focused on how we can extend our ministries beyond our doors. How do we reach our community? How do we better engage with our online worship attendees? How do we create deeper relationships with those attending our online events?

I think my main take-away from the training is that it is an old school mentality that we can knock on doors or stand in the streets to get people to come to church. Social media is a necessity. During these sessions they pointed out that YouTube and Instagram are quickly becoming major contenders in the social media arena. Facebook is still a useful tool but it is important to start analyzing the use of these other outlets if we aren't already. It is vital to reach people of all ages and each media venue has its own age bracket that it reaches. Using just one media outlet isn't enough.

Now, the problem with expanding our social networking is the limitations we have with a small staff and shortages of volunteers.

We are rebuilding the church and with that we are focusing on how we can expand our community service. In order to do that we need to rebuild our thinking. We need to rebuild our way of reaching people. We need to rebuild how we serve our ourselves.

Every leader, committee member, AND church member should prayerfully consider opportunities for growth and service. We can't rebuild if we are just watching. Everyone needs to be a participant. Everyone needs to serve. Attending worship on the weekend isn't enough.

We learned a lot from our training and we would like to incorporate some of these suggestions and lessons into our current work and ministries. We will likely need more volunteers and we will need lots of support. We hope we have yours.

What Makes A Hero?

As I sit and wonder what makes a hero, I question myself. Is it people who do the big news-making things? Or is a hero just an everyday person?
