The Father of National Parks, John Muir said, "Thousands of tired people are beginning to find out that going to the mountains is going home; that wilderness is a necessity; and that mountain parks are useful not only as fountains of timber and irrigating rivers, but as fountains of life." At the end of June, my family visited 6 National parks in Colorado and Utah. It was a whirlwind tour

through a beautiful part of the country. I was drawn to John Muir's due to our sermon series, "The Journey through Wilderness". As I gazed at mountains, valleys, canyons, and rivers, I reflected on the significance of wilderness in our lives. Wilderness disconnects us from busy life, cities, stress, news, and noise. Wilderness allows space for breathing, meditation, and quietness. I pray that all of you can experience the blessing of wilderness. I am grateful for this opportunity for summer break with my family.

As of July 1, I started my 8<sup>th</sup> year with MUMC. This is an exciting season in our congregation's faith journey. Phase 1 of the new church building was recently completed with the installation of shingles on July 17. I hope we can begin Phase 2 of the building project soon. We experienced some surprises in the sale of our current building (ie. the discovery of underground oil tanks.) However, our Trustee and Building Committees have worked hard to address issues. While the final closing date is postponed (due to the oil tanks,) we are moving closer to this date.

MUMC celebrated a magnificent "Pipe Organ Concert" on Saturday, July 9. The sanctuary was filled with the sounds of classic hymns and other musical offerings by our music ministry team. We raised more than \$3000 from this concert/fundraiser. On the following Saturday, July 16, we had a successful Pork Chop dinner and bake sale. This dinner/fundraiser raised nearly \$2000 for the Ridge Road Building Project. On Saturday, July 23, we had an encore performance of the church play, "Let's Go Fishing." The cast worked hard to offer a fun and poignant story of family and faith. Thank you to everyone who organized these wonderful fundraising events this past month.

On June 25-26<sup>th</sup>, Marlin Hartman celebrated the wonderful work of our ASP team in West Virginia. On July 3-4<sup>th</sup>, Chris Vause preached on the faithfulness of Daniel. Praise God for the gift of inspirational lay preachers! Praise God for the leadership of our VBS team, who hosted a fun One Day VBS on June 26. I am also grateful for the leadership of our UWF (United Women of Faith – formerly known as UMW) and all of our servant leaders who offered their help for Erlene Crater's funeral luncheon on June 18<sup>th</sup>, Jo Coop's funeral luncheon on July 17<sup>th</sup> and breakfast for Becki Wagnon on July 19<sup>th</sup>. Thank you all for your faithful service!

In July, our nation grieved the senseless shootings in Highland Park during the July 4<sup>th</sup> parade. Together, we cried out, "How long, O Lord? How long can we endure these recurring tragedies that plague our society?" I encourage us to not lose hope. Giving in to despair will not help us leave a better world for the next generation. In the midst of wilderness, let's keep our eyes fixed on Jesus Christ, who is the author and perfector of our faith. In the midst of hardship and struggles, let's hold fast to the promises of God, who is the same yesterday, today, and tomorrow. Just as the LORD led our ancestors through the wilderness to the Promised Land, the LORD will lead us to a better and brighter future. The key is to trust and obey – do not give up hope – remain prayerful and faithful – and do what we can each day to honor the LORD.

Several weeks ago, I visited one of our shut-ins. During our conversation, she reminded me that it is difficult to be patient. However, each of us has a choice. We can whine and complain when plans don't go our way OR we can be prayerful and faithful – we can smile and have a sense of humor about life's unexpected twists and turns. As I left the visit, I felt as if God had spoken to me. I am grateful for our prayer warriors, who patiently pray and invite us to do likewise.

Sisters and brothers, let's give thanks for God's faithfulness this summer. Let us seek the LORD and ask for God's mercy in the midst of our wilderness journey. As we take new steps toward our new home on Ridge Road, let's be prayerful and thankful – smiling and patient even when life takes an unexpected turn. In doing so, we declare our trust in God, for whom no circumstance is unexpected and no obstacle is too great. May we find joy in our LORD who loves us and invites us to trust and follow Him every day.

#### **ASP 2022**

The Minooka United Methodist Church completed its annual mission trip to the Appalachian area the first week of June. The 10 missionaries returned to Boonesville, Kentucky in Breathitt County. This area is famous for violence in early 1900's and lack of schools. Our two teams, led by Will and Jill Kohler, Beth Froidcoeur, Kelli Murphy and Marlin Hartman, reroofed a trailer and insulated the floor of a home. Our team members included Ava Staley, Kim Wences, Kyla Kohler, Owen Leonard and Chloe Sutton. The team experienced challenges of extreme heat all week (95 degrees each day and mid 80's at night), loss of air conditioning at the shelter, COVID causing some volunteers to return home and cooks calling in sick. Our team experienced hard work, challenges and people living in poverty. The Minooka United Methodist Church Mission Team would like to express our appreciation for all those who supported this effort, it can't be done without you.

God's work is not always easy or glamorous, our youth stepped up to do jobs that many would refuse. WWJD, I think we know who is beside us in spirit.
