One of the songs I find myself humming is the praise song, "Goodness of God." I was reflecting on these lyrics this week as I prayed over the sudden death of our congregant's young relatives, neighbors in hospice care, and friends who have been sick for a long time. I also thought of this song as I prayed over Kentucky flood victims, the people of Ukraine, and the victims of violence in our backyard and around the world. As I prayed, I reflected on the fragility and

fleeting nature of our lives, as well as God's presence in the midst of our hardships.

The lyric of **"Goodness of God"** hit me hard. Even in our suffering and struggle, the song reminds us that God's goodness exists in the reality that we are **"being held in God's hands each day."** Regardless of your hardships, you (and I) can always experience the goodness of God. After all, God never leaves nor forsakes us. God never sleeps nor slumbers. While we may stumble and wander away from God, God is always ready to receive us when we repent and turn back. **"You have led me through the fire in the darkest night, You are close like no other..."** Praise God for the gift of God's love and faithfulness that gives us strength and hope.

Praise God for the two underground oil tanks that were removed on Aug. 10th. I want to thank Jim Satorius (Trustee Co-Chair) and our other Trustees, who made sure that this complicated and messy situation was handled well. Let's pray together for the setting of a new closing date with our potential buyers. Praise God for your wisdom and faithfulness during this construction process.
