Recently, a friend shared that she felt sorry about asking God for too many things. She felt like her prayers were a laundry list of requests. She asked how she could mature in her prayer life and learn other ways to pray. Perhaps some of you are asking the same question. Yes, Jesus invites us to ask, seek, and knock, but what are the other aspects of prayer? How can we grow in our relationship with God?

Lent is a wonderful time to deepen our prayer life. Jesus models for us a healthy prayer life – one that is more than simply unloading our wishes to God. As we read in the Gospels, we see that prayer is a means of connecting with God. It is a way of communing and communicating with God. When we pray, we share the concerns of our hearts. However, prayer is also incorporated in listening, praise, and times of being still. God longs to hear us. However, God also wants to speak to us. So, rather than simply telling God your wish list and wrapping things up with a quick amen, let me encourage you to be still before God. Take time to listen for the whispers of the Holy Spirit. Take time to rest in the goodness of God's grace.

As we wrap up the second month of 2023, I am grateful for our congregation's flexibility in our temporary location. Thank you for your patience with different worship times and new meeting locations and times. Thank you for your gracious and positive attitudes as we do our best to be gracious guests in our current setting. Once again, I want to thank the Channahon UMC pastor, staff, and congregation for their warm welcome and embrace. We are grateful for the opportunity to share in ministry together (eg. joint worship services, Ladies' Prayer Breakfast, Men's Prayer Breakfast). We are grateful for their kindness, flexibility, and hospitality.

Speaking of partnerships, praise God for St. Mary Catholic Church, who continues to offer their space for the monthly Senior Lunch "Forever Young" ministry. Thank you to the leadership and devotion of Gail Flatness, Dawn Nemitz, and other volunteers, who bless over 100 seniors each month. Let's continue to offer prayers and support for this ministry, that shares God's love with our community seniors.

More good news – the construction on our new home on Ridge Road is moving along well. The windows are installed. The electricity and gas are connected. The process of painting the walls and ceilings is almost complete. While there's more work to be done, let's praise God for God's faithfulness and dreams of a new ministry in this new chapter of Minooka UMC.

On February 18, over 2 dozen MUMC leaders gathered for Diversity Training. Led by our guest speaker, John Hackett, we learned about generational differences among five generations: Builders, Boomers, Generation X, Millennials and Generation Z. I found these lessons very helpful as we dream about reaching our unchurched neighbors. Our neighbors are not monocultural. They are a wide mix of generations with different experiences, perspectives, and values. For example, our speaker shared that the total population of Millennials (born 1982-2000) and Generation Z (born after 2001) will be more than 75% of the entire U.S. population by the year 2028. Therefore, churches need to ensure that our ministries are relevant to the needs and questions of these generations. Thank you to Gail Girard, Chris Vause, and Marlin Hartman for organizing this meaningful event.

I want to thank John & Kim Nave for leading the "Mr. & Mrs." devotion during February. Every Sunday, John and Kim read their devotions on "Love & Marriage." Every Saturday, Stacy & Jennifer Ferguson read these devotions. I hope these devotions and sermons encouraged everyone in your relationships with God and one another.

In January, a small group started a Bible study through the Gospel of John. (You can see a picture of this group above.) It has been an exciting opportunity for learning, sharing, and building friendships as we deepened our faith in God. Speaking of small groups, I invite everyone to join one of our 6 Lenten Small Groups. We have a fabulous group of Small Group Leaders: Chris Vause, Karen Gaba, Cindy White, Marlin Hartman, and Kim Nave. I hope all of you will join us in this Lenten journey.


#### **Update on Church Leadership Implementation**




