Churches are notorious for holding onto former pastors instead of embracing new ones. I was blessed to start my ministry with Minooka UMC at a time when the congregation was ready for steady leadership. I am grateful for former pastors who paved the path for me at MUMC. Minooka UMC congregants opened their arms to welcome me. Church leaders encouraged me to try new ideas – some worked out well, others did not work out well. Yet, I always felt your support and care for me and my family. I encourage Minooka UMC to continue this wonderful legacy by embracing the incoming pastor with a warm and welcoming spirit. Here are two key lessons for a positive pastoral transition that I learned from the transition workshop. The workshop presenter, Rev. Jim Ozier shared that while transitions are difficult for both pastors and congregations, they are opportunities for new growth and development.

The first and most important step involves ATTITUDE. If we're going to have a positive transition, we need a positive and hopeful attitude. Even before we know the name of the new pastor, we can celebrate God's grace and ongoing work among us who will open the next chapter for MUMC. As we transition into our new home on Ridge Road – as we transition with pastoral leadership, we can encourage one another to be grateful, gracious, and optimistic for the future.

Second, the most important part of the transition is PRAYER. In the midst of uncertainty and anxiety, let's pray for the incoming pastor and family. Let's pray for the outgoing pastor and family. Let's pray for one another - our congregation members and families. Let's pray for the people in our neighborhoods and community, who God is calling us to reach out, serve and love during this period of change.

The Changeover Zone is a unique and special time. It can be an irreplaceable opportunity. Therefore, let's be hopeful and prayerful with the deep trust in Jesus who will strengthen us to get through the changeover zone beautifully. The building process on Ridge Road is coming along beautifully. I am so happy that we have been on this journey together. I encourage all of you to finish this season well by offering your full support. Keep praying. Keep serving. Let's continue to invite people to encounter God's grace through the ministries of MUMC.

God has been always faithful. I am grateful that our paths crossed for the last eight years. Minooka UMC has been gracious and patient with me with your encouragement and prayers. Thank you for allowing me to journey with you, to pray with you, to laugh with you, to cry with you, and to share your burdens. It has been a privilege and honor serving as your pastor – growing with you, and doing my best to lead and guide our ministry.
