REPORT OF THE PASTOR 2024 Rev. Dave Buerstetta Minooka UMC

In my first four months as Lead Pastor of Minooka United Methodist Church I have learned that this church is strong. The people are resilient and faithful. We care deeply about our neighbors and we are extremely excited to begin a new chapter in our new building on Ridge Road...soon.

Any day now.

Maybe by Christmas?

Or January? Definitely by January. We hope.

Even still, hope remains. Minooka UMC has Open Hearts for including, Open Minds for learning, and Open Doors for serving.

Enduring both the shock of a new pastor and the frustration of delays in occupying the new building has not dimmed the effectiveness of ministry done by this congregation. In 2023 we transformed lives by serving our community locally and globally as we:

- Sent 10 youth and adults on a mission trip to Floyd County, Kentucky where they helped build homes through Appalachian Service Project (ASP).
- Raised \$300 in the Lenten Coin Collection to help impoverished families in South America through Heifer International.
- Provided dinner for over 100 neighbors experiencing homelessness through our partnership with Daybreak Center.
- Gifted dozens of plants and over 260 bottles of cold water at Minooka Summerfest.
- Served hundreds of meals at our "Forever Young" Senior Luncheons.
- Aided victims of the deadly Maui fires through a special offering of \$1700!

We also continue growing in our faith by learning to be more like Jesus as we gather and worship. In 2023 Minooka UMC:

- · Celebrated six baptisms.
- · Welcomed five new members.
- Confirmed three young people who publicly professed their faith.
- Gathered for two ongoing bible studies.
- Explored new ideas in one monthly book group.
- And recently added a new support group for families.

From the beginning of our time together this summer, I've been heart-broken learning that so many of our people and families have had to survive a trauma. Significant illnesses; devastating accidents; and deaths of loved ones. Add to that the ending of important relationships through divorce or disputes and it is clear that so many of our folks have been through hell on earth. But you have not allowed that to be the end of your story!

I am amazed and inspired by your resiliency and your faithfulness. I am well aware I have not yet heard all of your stories of survival. But over and over again I've heard how this congregation helped people through those

horrible times. Being found family for each other is paramount to our identity as a congregation. The way forward into a future faithful to God whom we meet in Jesus involves caring for other people. We heal ourselves and our world in community.

We may be in a time of our wandering but we are not lost. Rather we are a found family with strong, deep roots that make us unafraid of acknowledging our suffering and unafraid of being joyful. That is a witness all of our neighbors need to hear.

As we move together with God into 2024, will do all we can to create our future as an inclusive people who shine a light into the shadows of the world through our compassion, our mercy, and our love.

Going through a pastoral change is a challenging time for any congregation. However, Minooka UMC has made that transition look easy. People have been and continue to be immensely welcoming of me and my family. Thank you!

The danger of thanking people by name is, of course, that some worthy folks gets left off the list. *Everyone* I've met here so far is willing to work hard at keeping this congregation faithfully following Jesus. No one acts as if a task is beneath them. For instance, six or eight people showed up to clean the chairs for our Ridge Road worship space and then move them into the new building. Thank you!

Still, there are a few folks I need to identify for how exceedingly helpful they are. Any times my transition into being your new pastor is bumpy are on me. All the ways that transition is going smoothly are due to their faithfulness to Jesus and dedication to our congregation. I am so very grateful for:

Office Manager Katie Wojcieszak — most of us have no idea just how much Katie does for us!

Chris Vause, the most engaged and engaging Lay Leader I've ever encountered.

The Membership Report was given by Karen Crawshaw. Three members who were listed on the "First Reading" at the October 24, 2021, Church Conference Meeting, have stated they wish to remain members of MUMC. Vote passed. Karen noted that the five members who passed away this past year, represented 199 years of membership at MUMC.

MUMC is in the process of building a new church on Ridge Road. Things are changing. Marlin Hartman, Chair of Church Council, reminded us that we need to adapt to these changes and stay positive.

Chris Vause reminded us that we will be sharing the Thanksgiving Service at Channahon United Methodist Church this year and will be using their facilities for our worship services when the sale of MUMC is final. She asked us to continually remember that we are a guest in their home.

Rev. Gilbert was asked about the "split" in the United Methodist Church. He said he likes to think of it as a "splintering". There are 367 churches in the Northern Illinois Conference and only eleven (11) are considering joining the Global Methodist Church. (In Texas approximately two hundred churches are considering the move.) His concern is that they are strong enough to survive. The decision to "splinter" from the UMC is definitely not one to make quickly. Application for non-profit (501-C3 status) has to be done and declared. Pastors to fill the need may not be available. Financial requirements must be met. Lots to consider before making the decision. The eleven churches in the conference have been in talks and have been respectful.

Karen Crawshaw made a motion to adjourn. Seconded by Marlin Hartman. Motion carried.

Pastor Sarah Hong closed the meeting with a prayer.
