Mark 2:1-12 (Contemporary English Version)

2 Jesus went back to Capernaum, and a few days later people heard that he was at home. 2 Then so many of them came to the house that there wasn't even standing room left in front of the door.

Jesus was still teaching 3 when four people came up, carrying a man on a mat because he could not walk. 4 But because of the crowd, they could not get him to Jesus. So they made a hole in the roof above him and let the man down in front of everyone.

5 When Jesus saw how much faith they had, he said to the man, "My friend, your sins are forgiven."

6 Some of the teachers of the Law of Moses were sitting there. They started wondering, 7 "Why would he say such a thing? He must think he is God! Only God can forgive sins."

8 At once, Jesus knew what they were thinking, and he said, "Why are you thinking such things? 9 Is it easier for me to tell this man his sins are forgiven or to tell him to get up and pick up his mat and go on home? 10 I will show you that the Son of Man has the right to

forgive sins here on earth.” So Jesus said to the man, 11 “Get up! Pick up your mat and go on home.”

12 The man got right up. He picked up his mat and went out while everyone watched in amazement. They praised God and said, “We have never seen anything like this!”

Welcoming & Observing a Meaningful Lent

Dear siblings in Christ:

The early followers of Jesus observed with great devotion the days of Jesus’ passion and resurrection. It became the custom of the Church that before Easter celebration there should be a 40-day season of spiritual preparation. During this season converts to the faith were prepared for Baptism. It was also a time when persons who had committed serious sins and had separated themselves from the community of faith were reconciled by penitence and forgiveness, and restored to participation in the life of the Church.

In this way the whole congregation was reminded of the mercy and forgiveness proclaimed in the gospel of Jesus the Christ, and the need we all have to repent and renew our faith.

I invite you therefore to observe a meaningful Lent: by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on the scriptures which point us to Jesus who is God’s Word, the Messiah, the Liberating King, the Christ.
